

#### - WMCC 1986-1987 -

Tom Lannon continued his marathon stint as president in 1986. The two year term limit in the club by-laws was waived during this period to ease planning of the 1986 CORSA Convention that was hosted by the West Michigan Corvair Club. The first part of 1986 was spent planning the convention. Raffles of Corvair items were held at every meeting to raise money for convention expenses. Meetings were still being held at the old Grand Rapids Public Museum. There was some time for other club activities however. Some of these activities included the Festival '86 parade, Hudsonville Car Show, and a halftime parade at the Kalamazoo Speedway. Rob Van Sledright presented a slide show titled "Bring 'em Back Alive" which was described as the Corvair in history, humor, fact, and fiction. The fall color tour was a caravan to the Binder Park Zoo in Battle Creek and the annual Christmas Party took place at the Hungry Lion restaurant.

Dick Hall was elected president for 1987. The club newsletter was officially christened *Lifter Noise*. This name was submitted by George Slomp. Some other names that were under consideration were *Blow-bye*, *Oil Sensor*, and *Murphy's Folly*. Bill Wright gave a tech session on a generator rebuild. The club participated in a number of parades including Festival '87, East Grand Rapids July 4<sup>th</sup> Parade, the Hudsonville Salad Bowl Celebration, and the Kalamazoo Wine & Harvest Festival. Other club activities included a picnic in Douglas Walker Park, a tour of Wes Myrick's Auto Museum in Cannonsburg, and a color tour/road rally. At the 1987 CORSA Convention in Chicago, Pat Murphy won 1<sup>st</sup> in class in the concours and John Shipman won the People's Choice award.

#### - A Grand Affair -

On July 30, 1986, Corvairs from across the nation invaded Grand Rapids for the 1986 CORSA National Convention. 1,042 people attended the convention that ran until August 2. The main attraction on Wednesday was the Econo Run, chaired by Bob Finch. 51 cars started at the Gerald R. Ford Museum, led by a TV crew from WZZM channel 13. The first leg of the tour took everyone to the Gilmore Car Museum in Hickory Corners. From there they went over to the Fenn Vineyards for some wine tasting. The tour then went through Sagatuk and Holland before ending near the Ford Museum. After the Econo Run, some people enjoyed a tour of Grand Haven and the Coast Guard Festival.

On Thursday, the rally took place. Dan Konkle was in charge of the rally and based on the article in the September 1986 *Communique*, he did a great job of making it tricky. The course went near the birthplace of Ed Cole and through Michigan apple country. CORSA also held its annual meeting and there was a tour of the Amway Center.

The main event happened on Friday. There were almost 200 Corvairs parked on Calder Plaza for the concours (chaired by Bill Wright) and the People's Choice car display (chaired by Mark Lannon). Eighty of the cars were in the People's Choice car display, which was in its third year as an event. Just about every model and type of Corvair was represented, including an UltraVan, Yenko Stingers, a Fitch Sprint, a Solar Cavalier, a Corvair RV conversion, and a Corvair-engined Fiat 850 racer. I understand that it was quite a sight to see.

The Autocross took place on Saturday out at Grand Valley State College (now Grand Valley State University). Over 70 drivers decided to try their skill on the course laid out by Dan Konkle and the West Michigan chapter of the SCCA. Just as the event got underway, a downpour drenched the course and participants. After an hour delay, the autocross resumed and some impressive runs were posted including Warren LeVeque with a time of 30.84 seconds in his Le Vair Spyder. About 600 people enjoyed the awards banquet where Bill Pursell of Madison, Wisconsin was awarded the Edward N. Cole trophy. He and his wife Deanne drove from Madison in an unrestored 1966 Monza. It was estimated that a total of 350 Corvairs were in Grand Rapids the week of the convention.


