
We would like to have a couple more project nights to help members out with their cars. If you would like to host a night at your garage, please let a board

## Gilmore Show

We will once again be hosting our annual show as part of the Red Barn Spectacular at the Gilmore Museum in Hickory Corners.

For those who have never been there, it is quite simply a very nice facility. The barns are filled with interesting automobiles. Here's how it all started (taken from their website):

"The Gilmore Car Museum began in 1963 as the hobby of Donald S. Gilmore when his wife, Genevieve, gave him an antique car for his birthday —a 1920 Pierce-Arrow "project car." With the help of some friends, the auto was placed under a tent and a full restoration followed. The hobby soon grew into a collection of over 30 automobiles. Mr. Gilmore purchased 90 acres of farm property and had several historic barns dismantled piece by piece and moved to the site. It was Mr. Gilmore's wife who suggested the idea of turning the collec-

tion into a museum where future generations could enjoy the restored cars for years to come. The Gilmores established a non-profit foundation, and opened the museum to the public for the first time on Sunday, July 31, 1966. Donald Gilmore passed away in 1979, and Mrs. Gilmore in 1990, but the legacy they began continues to grow."

This year our show within the show will also be the 30th Anniversary celebration for our club. As such we are hoping to have some special events. At least we're planning on serving cake to those who attend.

Plan to come out and bring the family.


