Director's Corner—The Wish List

Our editor has asked for articles from the members of the board, so I thought I would take the easy way out and make a list. What ten cars would I have if I could? It would certainly be no problem to come up with ten Corvairs, so to make it more of a challenge I decided to exclude them. Here are my ten Brand Xs, oldest to most recent.

1914 Stutz Bearcat series E Torpedo Roadster. Was there ever a better name for a car? The most fun you can have with an engine that only revs to 1500rpm. Cannonball Baker set a transcontinental speed record in a Bearcat, and all the Swells had one. Color? They look good in cream.

32 Hudson Essex Terraplane Roadster. I saw one of these at the Gilmore Museum and fell in love with it. This was a factory hotrod, with Hudson's biggest engine in their smallest chassis - five more horses than Ford's V8 in a body 200lbs lighter. A lot of speed and hillclimb records were set in the 30s with Terraplanes. I'll take mine in maroon with black fenders.

38 Buick Century Opera Coupe. Late 30s Buicks just knock me out. General Motors clearly had the best prewar design studio, their cars displaying a sense of line and proportion that no other American car company could match. For my 38 I'd replace the straight eight

with Buick's later nail-valve V8 with a four carb manifold, put on some baby Moons and blue dot taillights, but not otherwise customize it. Navy blue.

50 Pontiac Chieftain Sedanette. I don't particularly want one of these as much as I would like any car with a good story. A Pontiac like this with only eleven thousand miles was offered on eBay. When new, the black twodoor fastback had been an Iowa couple's honeymoon car and they had made a grand tour of the West in it. When the husband returned from Korean War duty the body style proved too small for the family they started. The sentimental pair couldn't bear to part with their beloved Chieftan so it was carefully stored and preserved for fifty years. What's better than true love?

53 Allard J2X Roadster. A wonderful gallimaufry of lights, bulges, scoops, portholes, tiny windscreens, and a sidemount spare, all powered by a vintage Cadillac V8 with 3 speed trans. A successful hotrod roadracer despite a swing axle front suspension and crummy brakes. For the faint of heart, available as a replica without the suspect original mechanical bits. British racing green, of course.

56 Dodge Station Wagon. There are a lot of fine alternatives in the mid-50s wagon class, but the Dodge hits my

eye just right. Get it with the little D-500 hemi and any of the attractive two or three tone paint schemes of the period. It would look just right towing a vintage camping trailer. Are we there yet?

57 Studebaker Transtar Pickup. This should be a solid western truck with original faded paint, dents and dust. Don't even THINK of 'restoring' it. Ideally it will have some Lone Star longnecks under the seat for extra rattles and a radio that pulls in George Jones.

59 Buick Invicta Convertible. I'm not fond of enormous soft cars, but John Cole says everybody should have a highway cruiser, and the mighty finned Buick is GM's best design of this year. All black with whitewalls would be magnificent. Honorable mention in the outrageous late-50s ragtop category: 57 Chrysler 300C, 58 Edsel, 59 Imperial.

66 Renault-Alpine A110 Cabriolet. The spiritual opposite

of the Invicta. Something on this list should be rear engined, lightweight, and get good gas mileage. This fiberglass sportscar from Alpine, Renault's performance ally, is the civilized convertible verion of the legendary rally machine. In butterscotch (the color, not the syrup).

85 Renault 5 Maxi Turbo. Picture a LeCar with a tempermental 92 cubic inch 350hp motor in the back seat and huge rear fender flares, built for battling the Audi Quattros in World Rally competition. Decidedly uncivilized. In French racing blue and high zoot rally trimlights, decals, etc.
