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### CONVENTION PLANNING UPDATE

We had a good showing at the General Membership Meeting in October where we focused our discussion on the Convention. Everyone in attendance received an overview of our goals, the plan, selected venue sites and the schedule. We discussed how we have broken down the various areas of responsibility down into manageable functions and announced who among our Club has agreed to coordinate those functions. We also discussed how the general membership (that's you) can help. Lastly, we asked for feedback and answered questions. I believe everyone left with a better understanding of what's in store for ... A Vairiation in Kalamazoo 2013.

Our friends from CORSA; Harry Jensen, Larry Claypool and Jason Cesana, will be visiting us December 7 through 9, staying at the Host Hotel. Ryan and myself plan to present the Convention Plan: schedule, contracts, sites and budget. I'm sure there be a tweak or two since these gentlemen have valuable suggestions on what works best. This will be our second time around with Harry and Larry so they are fully aware of our original bid and capabilities of our host site. We look forward to their visit so we can produce a refined plan, endorsement of ideas and required funding.

In my first article, I mentioned that the Plan was in place. Venues were selected and contracts negotiated. We now have Coordinators in place to manage our functional areas. By mid-December we'll have an endorsed, final plan. To make certain we have utilized all the resources available to us, your Convention Committee will also be meeting with the Board of the Detroit Area Corvair Club mid-January to share their experiences from 2010. It should be a Vairy good thing for us. Seeing their excitement and support for our Convention makes me warmer than a gas-powered heater.

Speaking of support, I want to express my heartfelt thanks to those who have agreed to step forward and be Coordinators. Truly appreciated. Our Club spirit is alive and well. So, now is the time for finishing touches. Our Coordinators will be estimating what type of assistance they will need and looking for the volunteers. As an example, for the Concours and the AutoX we'll need roughly 20 helpers. Registration and Hospitality will need a significant number of helpers throughout the week but the time span is stretched out. These are the heavy labor events and we NEED YOU. We all want our Convention to run smoothly so whether you volunteer to sign-up for a preferred assignment or a Coordinator asks or calls you directly, PLEASE say; "how can I help". As Kennedy said... "ask not what blah, blah blah.

NOTE: While we'll need every Club members to fill-in for more than one assignment, we still want everyone to ENJOY the Convention and not feel tied down or burdened.

At our November 20th Meeting, we welcome TOM LANNON, former WMCC President and 1986 Convention Co-Chair as our guest speaker. Tom will show a historical slide presentation of the '86 Convention in GR and share his perspectives on what it took to put together a very successful CORSA Convention. 


attention (at least we like to think so).
