#### A Die Hard Story

I think it is appropriate that we end our 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary year with a memory from one of our long time members. Thank you to WMCC Charter Member Rob Van Sledright for the following story that he submitted.

During the 1960's and until the middle 1970's Bob O'Neill was the Corvair doctor for Corvair owners on the south side of Grand Rapids. His shop was on 40<sup>th</sup> Street just west of Division Avenue. He was almost exclusively doing full-time Corvair repairs and service.

Corvair owners living on the northern areas of Grand Rapids could get service and repairs at Chuck's Garage. He was on East Leonard Street next to what is now part of the Vitale's Italian Restaurant property. Chuck's Garage had a distinctive sing in front: a large, orange WWII bomber wing tank mounted atop a tall, steel post. No doubt a war surplus item.

One day in the 1970's, Bob O'Neill and fellow employee Scott McIntosh (Scott may have been one of the charter members of WMCC) decided to find out just how reliable the 80 hp engine was from a parted out rusty car. They secured the engine to a wooden pallet and started it up, blocking the throttle at wide open. After about 20 minutes of hearing the engine scream at top speed, they shut it down to make a change to the test.

Next, they drained all of the oil from the oil pan and restarted the engine, again with the throttle blocked at wide open. The engine endured this test for about twelve minutes when it finally seized up.

Kids – DO NOT try this at home! At least not to a good engine!
