# **November Meeting Recap**

A total of 10 members were present. The Club provided donuts and coffee. Our meeting was held directly in the museum surrounded by remarkable pristine classics – one of which was the venerable 1935 Auburn Boattail Speedster. Jamie patiently practiced his Docent skills as we viewed nearly 100 assorted cars from early Ultra Classics to 50's luxury's, 60's muscle and today's Super/Exotic cars.

Two matters of business were discussed after completing our tour; Pinewood Derby Plan and the Annual Election of Board Members and Directors.

<u>Pinewood Derby Plan</u> – Dave D. discussed our plan to proceed toward determining viability and personal contact with members. After polling among present attendees we had eight people interested in building and racing a derby car already. Dave noted that only nine other potential members would need to be contacted. The group also discussed racing prior built derby cars. In turns of competition in racing for the first and second prize (\$50 & \$25), only newly built kits provided free-of-charge by the club could be used. However, racing among those bringing vintage racers was encouraged with bragging rights or possibly a consolation prize involved. Discussion of a Youth Division also resurfaced with potential numbers appearing low. The group felt that should a member wish to assist a son, daughter or grandchild with a derby car that would be encouraged, with a possible prize. John Cole reminded us that he has access to an official track and would help with set-up, tear-down and return. The club will need a volunteer(s) to assist. Dave D. will complete contacts, order sufficient kits and prepare a rules sheet. He will have kits available at the December Christmas Party, Saturday, December 2nd hosted by Becky and Doug Lectka or by pick up at his house.

A motion was made to proceed with the Pinewood Derby as our Zoup Off 2024 entertainment. Motion unanimously carried.

<u>Annual Elections</u> – As we draw near to the end of 2023, three members' terms of office are to expire; Doug Lectka, Treasurer, Dennis Willson and Steve VanderHelm as Directors. Both Doug and Steve graciously re-nominated themselves and John Cole stepped up to nominate himself as our third Board Member for election. A motion was made to accept all nominees. Motion unanimously carried. West Michigan Corvair Club CORSA Chapter 495 will proceed into 2024 with the following Board of Directors; Dave Dykwell – President ('24), Ry Counterman - Vice President ('24), Dave Ziebarth – Secretary/Editor ('24), Doug Lectka – Treasurer ('25), John Cole ('25), Steve VanderHelm ('25) and Matt Zerilli ('24) as Directors.
