WMCC History - Meeting Activities

Most of our meetings throughout the years consisted of a brief business meeting followed by some sort of entertainment. Early on, a popular choice for entertainment was watching a movie (with a real film projector). Sometimes it would be an old, popular movie and other times it would be either a tech film related to the Corvair. Slide shows were also very popular. Once the VCR came into vogue, a video would be viewed.

We also had tech sessions. The first evidence of a tech session was in 1975 where Jack Corcoran showed how to rebuild a carburetor. He actually took one apart and put it back together with a rebuild kit. Bill Wright rebuilt a generator in a tech session in 1987. Sometimes the tech session would be held at Cliff Murphy's garage or at the home of a member. Some meetings just had general Q&A sessions where members would ask for help in troubleshooting an issue with their Corvair.

During the 1970's into the early 1980's we would attend a meeting at a site where we would get a tour of a manufacturing plant. We toured the GM plant on Burlingame multiple times as well as the Kent Skills Center and Sherwin-Williams. The content of the Sherwin-Williams tour would often revolve around tips for painting our cars.

Once the West Michigan Whitecaps arrived in 1994, we would attend one game a year until 2001.

Other activities included bowling, lawn games at a members home, and a tour of an automobilia collection.

A more recent activity for our meetings is attending a local cruise night. We usually hit Fricano's Pizza once a summer. We've also attended cruise nights at Gilmore Car Museum, Rosie's Diner, and Culver's.
