WMCC History - Color Tours

One constant event in the history of the West Michigan Corvair Club has been a fall color tour. We had had one almost every year of our existence unless we had a rainout (apparently Y2K caused an issue in 2000 as we didn't have one then that I could see). The first mention of a color tour was in the September 1975 newsletter. The club was going to use the September membership meeting to gauge interest and try to plan one. I could not find any evidence that it ended up happening. In 1977 we had a rallye to go along with the color tour. So not only did you admire the colors, you also had to pay attention to other details (number of railroad crossings, exit numbers, church service start time) to answer a rallye guiz.

For a few years we would tour just north of Grand Rapids and end up at either Bob Laubscher's home on Bill's Lake or Gerry Miske's cottage on Pine Island Lake. These tours would usually end in a potluck.

There were some years where we would have a color tour with other car clubs. In 1986 we toured the Battle Creek area with the Detroit Area Corvair Club, Bryan (Ohio) Corvair Club, and Michiana Corvair Club. In the early 1990s we would combine with the West Michigan Pontiac Club, West Michigan Mustang Club, and West Michigan Collector Car Club. Starting in 1994, it was just us and the West Michigan Pontiac club and we would take turns planning the tour. 1999 was the last year we combined with another club.

In 2001 we made our way to Saugatuck to the car collection of WMCC member Bill Klage. After spending some time admiring Bill's cars, he led us on a tour of Saugatuck. One memory is the parking lot at Oval Beach was almost entirely covered in sand. Most of us managed to get through it but Rob VanSledright "beached" his Corvair so we had to help him push it out.

Other destinations over the years include the R.E. Olds Museum in Lansing, Apple Blossom Festival in Bangor, Oktoberfest car show in Pentwater (twice), Oktoberfest parade in Douglas, various wineries and orchards, and an old Sinclair gas station that was restored into Jollay's Dairy Bar near Coloma. In 2016 we combined the color tour with our overnight trip and went to the Studebaker Museum in South Bend and the RV/Motorhome Hall of Fame in Elkhart.

Even COVID did not stop us from having a color tour. In 2020 we made our way up to Ludington and dined outdoors at Ludington Bay Brewing Company.

Other restaurants we stopped at over the years include Squires Inn and Woodshed Pub in Rockford, What-Not-Inn in Fennville, The Brown Bear in Pentwater, Sam's Joint near Gun Lake, Cornwell's Turkeyville in Marshall, 57 Brewpub & Bistro in Greenville, and Big Hart Brewing Company in Hart.
