The View Through the Windshield by Bob Marlow

There is so much to tell you this month, I almost don't know where to start. It involves special people, special opportunities, and a revised and exciting club calendar of events for 2009.

During March we will have exclusive access to a priceless one-off Corvair-powered show car, as the famous Fitch Phoenix comes to New Jersey for an NJACE activity. It continues next month with our club's first-ever all-makes benefit car show. Then, later in the year we will be conducting a unique promotional and benefit fit event that will showcase our Corvairs and demonstrate our heart. Finally, we will play host to a regional

the Corvair's introduction to the market, 50 years to the day. Each of these activities is new and unique, and so distinctive that I am giving each their own section of this column, starting right now:

John Fitch and the Fitch Phoenix

March will be John Fitch Month in NJACE. If you do not know John Fitch and his many contributions not only in the Corvair arena but in countless other fields, this month affords you the opportunity for two close-up looks and this special individual and his work. Understand first that John Fitch, who is now in his nineties, began his remarkable automotive career after demonstrating his character and heroism as a decorated bomber and fighter pilot in World War II.

Turning to racing in the post-war years, John Fitch became the Sports Car Club of America's first national champion. He won the 1953 Sebring 12-hour race. He was invited to become the only American member of the Mercedes-Benz factory team, where among his teammates was the legendary Juan Manuel Fangio. He was one of the principals behind the design and construction of Connecticut's Lime Rock Park and he was the track's first general manager.

Having been a participant in the 1955 24-hour LeMans race, during which a terrible racing crash took the lives of scores of spectators, John Fitch began to devote himself to the issue of racing safety, which he continue to do to this day. He also has been developing passive safety measures for highway applications, the most widely-known of which is his patented Fitch Barrier, the sand-filled barriers which guard abutments.

On the cover of the February issue of the CORSA Communique is a photograph of a 1960 Corvair fording a stream in late 1959, and behind the wheel is John Fitch, a consultant to Chevrolet on the Corvair project. Not long after the Corvair was introduced, John Fitch developed the Fitch Sprint, the performance-modified Corvairs which he marketed from 1962 through 1969. **During** this period, he designed and built the Fitch Phoenix, a prototype for a Corvair-powered sports car that was to be introduced as a 1967 model. But by coincidence, the safety legislation brought about by Ralph Nader's accusations in *Unsafe at any Speed* doomed the project, as John Fitch's company did not have the financial depth to crash-test cars. The Phoenix never went into production and the one prototype remains the only example every built.

Now, you might think that all this represents a pretty good career for a gentleman now more than 90 years old. But John Fitch is not retired, not by a long shot. Which brings me to our meeting program this month: At our quarterly business meeting at the Mount Olive Grill on Wednesday evening, March 18th, we will be screening the PBS documentary, of *A Gullwing at Twilight: The Bonneville Ride of John Fitch*. This beautiful and evocative film documents John Fitch's effort, just earlier this decade, to set a new land speed record utilizing an original Mercedes-Benz gullwing coupe.

Then, only days afterward, we will have exclusive access to the Fitch Phoenix for a very special NJACE Tech Session, on Sunday, March 22. Our Tech Session will take place in the shop at Guaranteed Auto Repair in Fair Lawn, and it will be on the subject of replacing valve stem seals in a Corvair engine. The Corvair engine that will be the focus of this tech session is the one powering the Fitch Phoenix. The car is being prepared to enter the Saratoga Automobile Museum in Saratoga Springs, New York, and several NJACE members, led by NECC President Brian O'Neill, are assisting with the preparation of the car.

By attending this tech session not only will you be able to learn more about valve stem seal replacement in a Corvair engine, but you will be able to see and touch and photograph the beautiful Italian-bodied Fitch Phoenix.

NJACE - VFW April Car Show & The Wounded Warrior Project

For more that 20 years, NJACE has conducted a Spring swap meet each April called the "Garage Sale." But after Nortech Corporation, our host for this event from 1986 through 2004, was sold, we moved first to Mercedes Benz, then to Fireman's Field, and last year to VFW Post 5702 in Franklin Lakes. At Post 5702 we added a car show for this first time, and among the reasons for this was the dwindling of swap meet participation as the hobby (and the internet!) evolved.

Well, it was quite obvious that the car show portion of the event eclipsed the swap meet portion, and so for 2009 we are eliminating the swap meet entirely in favor of an expanded and enhanced car show.

Expanded? Enhanced? Yes. First, it is not a Corvair show, it is an All-Makes show, open to every kind of car provided that it is at least 25 years old. Second, a concerted effort is being put forth to reach a large audience of both car owners to be potential participants and spectators to come see the show. Third, and definitely most importantly, the show is being structured as a benefit for the VFW Wounded Warrior Project.

During 2009 NJACE, which has a strong membership base and a solid financial footing, will be doing more to "give back," as they say. As a club we have a history of giving, dating back to a highly successful American Cancer Society benefit road rally in the early 1980s and including memorial donations and other gifts. But for 2009 we intend to do more than ever. This car show is where we begin.

The Wounded Warrior Project at VFW Post 5702 helps military veterans with traumatic injuries readjust and reenter civilian life. Our car show is being organized specifically to raise funds for this cause, and we are priming the pump, so to speak, with our efforts and with our checkbook. NJACE is fronting all the costs for this show, but we are also soliciting donations. These donations will not only offset the show's costs, they will also generate additional funds for the Wounded Warrior Project.

As I write, we have already received donations sufficient to cover the trophy costs, and more donations are arriving regularly. Members with e-mail addresses on file with the club have already received a message from club Vice President and show chairman David Main, outlining how each member can help solicit sponsorships and donations. Numerous donors already are making their donations in the name of a family member or friend who served.

But time is short. The show date is Sunday, April 19, which is only seven or so weeks away as you read this. Collectively, we have much to do to make this show as successful as it can be. A copy of the show flyer is included with this newsletter. You can also download the flyer in PDF format from the NJACE web site. Print extra copies and share them, with fellow car enthusiasts, with businesses in your area, with friends. Come to the March and April breakfast meetings, as well as to the March business meeting, to volunteer to help. Contact David Main at <u>dmain90826@aol.com</u> to lend a hand.

A lineup of Corvairs, the unique American cars with front trunks, outside a supermarket. If every shopper that day buys even one or two non-perishable food items and places them in a Corvair's trunk, we can collect a bounty for the food bank while at the same time demonstrating our unique vehicles to the general public. It's a gem.

Right now, the exact date for this event has not been set, as we seek a date agreeable not only to ourselves but also to Shop-Rite and to the food bank. But to say that the preliminary reaction has been positive would be an understatement. When we approached Shop-Rite with the plan, their response was not when could we do it, but at how many stores could we do it! Clearly, the opportunity for significant pre- and post-event publicity is significant, one of the rewards for thinking of others before ourselves.

We expect this event to be scheduled for either August or September, with September being our current preference. Watch this space for more information.
