Having handed out maps for all, Rob led us through the New Providence area of New Jersey and into and through the "upscale" region of Basking Ridge and Madison. This is NOT the area of New Jersey that nay-sayers associate with the Garden State. We passed beautiful homes with, as car-lovers often note, large garages. In fact, to be socially acceptable in some areas, it appeared that one must have at least a three vehicle garage if not a six.

The tour took us to the beautiful campus of Drew University through which we navigated where others have matriculated.

It was then on to the Great Swamp National Wildlife Refuge, managed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and anchored by the impressive Helen C. Fenske Visitor Center. At one time, the site was being considered as a place for a regional airport. Now, it is a refuge for wildlife that is common to the area. The tour started at the Center for orientation and a visit to the Gift Shop. Rob even gave out "Thank You for Participating" posters.

If you've never seen a bald eagle in the wild (or captivity), this tour afforded that opportunity. The group walked along the elevated paths through the wooded refuge area. We saw turtles and I believe the turtles saw us. At the Raptor section, we saw various species of injured birds that were being treated and saved by a private foundation.

After visiting the Great Swamp it was on to lunch. Oh, the lunch! The group enjoyed a delicious lunch, typical banter, and friendship at the Ridge Inn in Basking Ridge.
