ACORN June Activity Report Ken Emerson Tech Session - 6/22/24

ACORNers attending:

- Ken Emerson
- Jim Bartasevich

At one of our spring breakfasts, Ken mentioned that his '66 Monza coupe began to run roughly when started it following is return from Florida. We set up a session for June 22 at his house to investigate. Besides Ken, I was the only ACORNer who attended.

Before starting it, I checked a number of things that can cause rough running:

- v Loose sparkplug wires at the plug and at the distributor
- v Loose/worn parts under the distributor cap

v Vacuum leaks: Hoses for the choke pull-offs, balance tube hoses, loose carbs, vacuum advance hose, and missing carb gaskets

There were no problems from the these potential sources of rough running.

Next, I pulled the number 1 and number 2 sparkplugs to check for combustion on each side of the engine. Other that wider than spec gaps, they both looked similar so it wasn't a fuel imbalance from the carburetors.

I decided to check all the plugs and found that the sparkplug wire connector inside the boot for number 6 was very rusty. Rusty? I though those connectors were brass, but it looks like some cost-cutting has been going on in the plug wire industry. They appeared to be brass plated. All the rest of the plugs and boots at the plugs were okay except for the wide plug gaps which I reset to factory specs.

I was going to try to clean up the connector with abrasive paper, but the rust caused it to become stuck in the boot. After squirting some WD-40 inside the boot, and working it a bit, the wire came out. I sanded the inside of the connector with a piece of paper that was rolled up, but it was difficult to get all of the surface because of the configuration of the connector. Because of the rust, I also couldn't determine if the wire was even still connected to the connector. I didn't bring an ohmmeter that could have been used to check continuity.

After reinstalling the wire in the boot and then on to the plug, Ken started the car. However, the rough running [miss] was still there, so the wire needed to be replaced. I suggested to Ken that he contact Clark's to see if they sold single plug wires and showed him how to replace it.

While looking around for vacuum leaks, I noticed that there was a Rube Goldberg arrangement for the crankcase vent. Whoever worked on the engine at one time apparently didn't have the correct vent tube. I suggested to Ken that he check with the ACORN parts supply to see if we have a vent tube for his engine. He also needs the small, steel tube that runs from the PG vacuum modulator to the balance tube. Rube struck again when someone used a piece of vinyl hose instead of the steel tube with a rubber hose connector at each end. This hose was becoming kinked and hard from the heat.

The remaining mystery is how the end of that sparkplug wire connector became as rusty as it was. All of the other wires were okay.

-(3 Available)- Hot "Valve Lash Adjustment Valve Covers", have 6 holes in the appropriate places for socket access

-Coil Spring Compressors (pair)

UNISYNC- Carb Balancing Tool

-(3 Available)- Series 1, AXLE York Removal Tools, you will need a MAPP gas torch,,,and a big hammer too.,.... -Oil Pressure Tester, Oil Filter Bolt fitted with flexible tubing to an Oil Pressure Gage...great to check/assure oil pressure when first firing up a brand newly rebuilt motor.....

Grease Gun Adapter- for greasing HD Universal Joints that have grease fittings in place...

(2 Available)- Steering Wheel Pullers

-Harmonic Balancer Pulley Removal Tool...works with the engine in normal position,,,just remove the Oil Filter...

Valve Guide Removal Punch

-Wire Brush Reamer - to clean out cross-drilled holes in Crankshaft during a rebuild -Differential Side Gear Adjuster tool

-**Piston Ring(s) Compressor**, used when installing a Piston/Con Rod Assy into Jug, then attaching con rod to crankshaft

Fan Bearing Greasing Tool

-(2 Sets Avail.)-12 tubes-(Enough for one side of the Motor)- to hold JUGS in place whilst installing Piston/Com Rod Assys into the jugs, and bolting up the connecting rod cap around the appropriate Crankshaft Journal...VERY helpful!!!
