I have been helping R&L with installing new door panels on their 4-door '64. The front panels went on without a problem, but we ran into a snag with the rear panels. The mounting nails and the door panel plugs did not line up perfectly. The lower nails are offset by as much as half an inch. We used Velcro tabs in place of the lower nails. It worked great on the right panel but there is an



added issue with the left panel that needs more pondering. One of the issues with both panels is the raised border interfering with the installation of the window handle. We will have to cut a small section of the raised border to clear the handle.

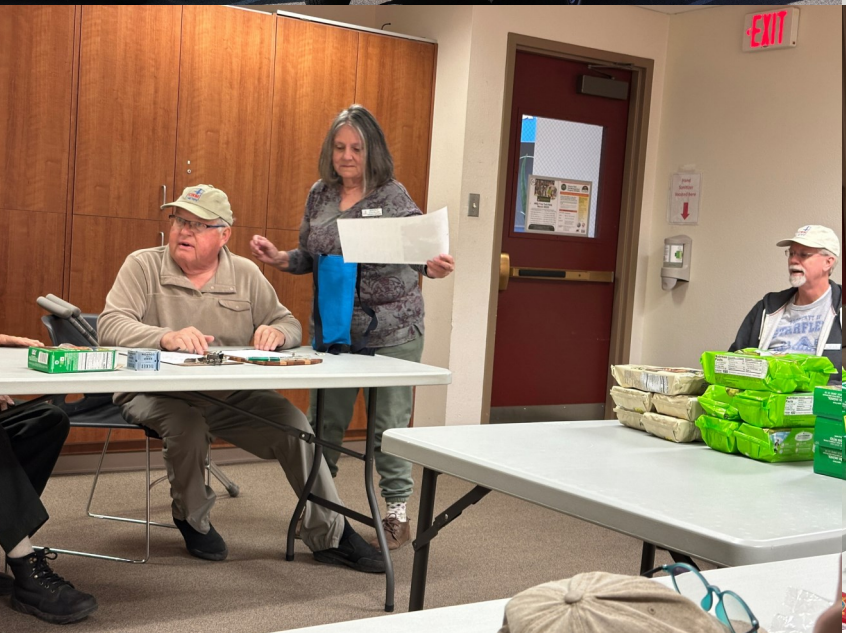
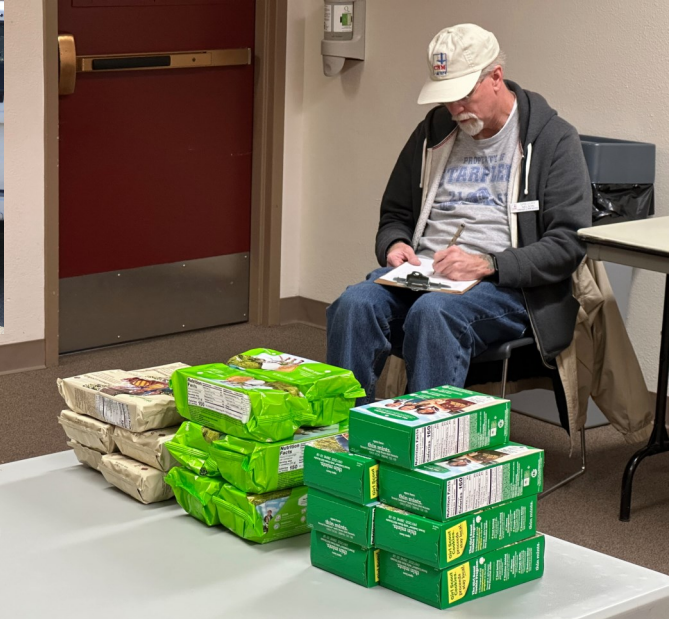
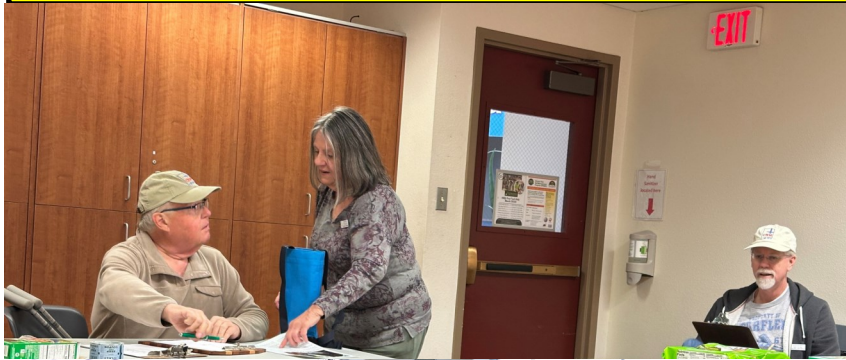

Tosh & Annie's Ultra Van—Steve Gongora

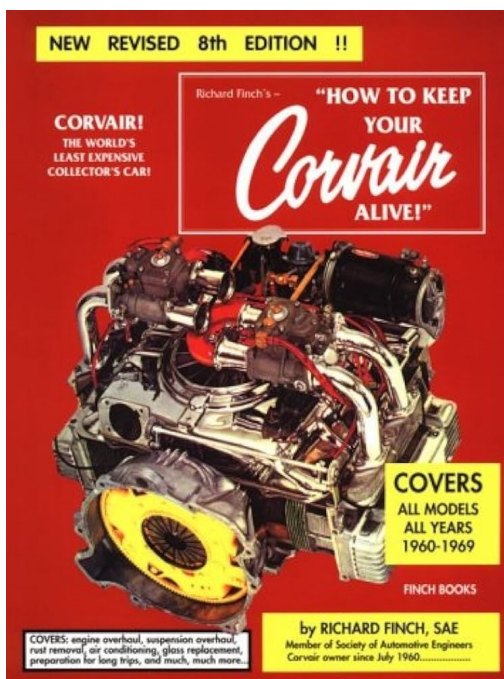
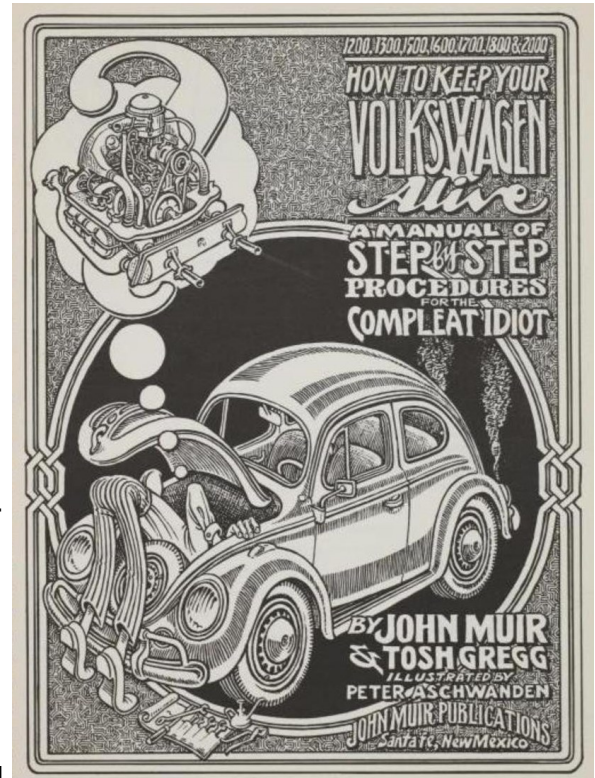
Rita and I have known Tosh & Annie since 2004 and we are fortunate to have them in our club. Tosh Gregg co-authored a book with John Muir. You might be familiar with it. **"How to Keep Your Volkswagen Alive"**. They did most of the writing of the book in Taos and Santa Fe with a few meetings in Manzanillo, Mexico. A most creative place to write a book. Through the years, Tosh has restored cars including a 1962 Alfa Romeo Giulia, which he and Annie displayed in Santa Fe at one of the 4th of July Plaza Shows. Tosh is one of those super talented individuals who can figure out how to solve mechanical issues and make a car better than the factory. His Alfa Romeo was spectacular.

I'm glad that Tosh and Annie were taken by the Corvair Ultra Van. They purchased the van from CNM members, Dan and Carol Palmer. Incidentally, Dan and Carol went to school with my father, Hector in the 1940's in Corrales, New Mexico. Dan was another Renaissance man who was a master at everything he did, from playing his cello with the NM Philharmonic with to building experimental planes with a Corvair engine. He was head of the NM Experimental Association.

When Tosh purchased the Ultra Van, he was presented with a few issues and problems concerning the transmission and transaxle. After several attempts, he finally worked out the kinks and then decided to transform the front suspension with power rack and pinion steering and suspension. What an undertaking. He rebuilt the motor and it runs perfectly.

The Ultra Van was present at our 51st CNM Anniversary Dinner and it was a treat for members who have seen one in the past and for members who have never seen one before. My cousin Richie and his wife Jan were at the dinner. Richie introduced me to Corvairs in 1966 and he had never seen or heard of one. If you stayed after the dinner, Tosh and Annie opened their RV to anyone who wanted to see this unique interior. The Ultra Van was designed like an airplane fuselage, incorporating the gas tank into the lower body of the frame. It made it more stable when you drive on the open highway.

Tosh was influential in inspiring another CNM member, Richard Finch, longtime friend of Jim Pittman, to write a book as well. You might be familiar with it. **"How to Keep Your Corvair Alive"**. Richard refined the Corvair motor with many enhancements. Jim rebuilt a motor with Richard and drove his 1966 Corvair with all the benefits of Richard's upgrades. Richard used to work for NASA and was an expert welder. He, like Tosh and Dan upgraded the cars they owned and drove. Richard went on to write two more books. One was on welding, which used to be sold at Home Depot, where you could buy welding equipment. The other book was on adding air conditioning to your Corvair. Richard's brother, Phil, took over the estate when Richard passed away and a few of our CNM members, David Huntoon, Tarmo Sutt, and others were there to help Phil with some of the needed duties in identifying parts and engines.
