






1974 Triumph—Steve Gongora

It was donated by a couple that owns the La Fonda Hotel and was meant to help with funding for the Indian Market. My friend Upton Ethelbah was one of the artists who contributed a stone piece for the rear view mirror. This car had many famous Indian artists contributing their talents to make this a showcase vehicle

with supreme value. Jeanette Ferrara, from the Isleta Pueblo came to the House of Covers and asked if we could create the seats out of Pendleton material, which she






Los Luceros Fall Tour —October 19, 2024
