

Lesson Learned

The Village at Alameda Car Show Report



I know many of you have had the experience of organizing your first car show and HOPING that everything would go right. No one wants to work on an event that doesn't succeed. I guess the real question is how do you limit the chance that things will go wrong? I hope that after reading this article, you "newbies" out there will do a better job planning your show!

I know many of you have had the experience of organizing your first car show and HOPING that everything would go right. No one wants to work on an event that doesn't succeed. I guess the real question is how do you limit the chance that things will go wrong? I hope that after reading this article, you "newbies" out there will do a better job planning your show!

Let's look at how the Village at Alameda retirement community ultimately succeeded with their show. The Community is a senior living facility in northern Albuquerque. The folks in charge, Rhonda Griegos, Executive Director and Justina and Daniel Roybal who act as activities directors for the facility decided to have a car show for the benefit of their residents and to increase their standing with the public at large. I need to mention that the show was wonderful, but it didn't become that way without doing some of the right things, and overcoming a couple of questionable things.

The first "bump in the road" came with the setting of a date. Many people ask me how to set the right date of their event. They make the mistake of not allowing time for planning and publicizing their show. In this case Alameda began their plans a mere TWO months before the show. That's only two months to do all the things necessary to plan for an event and to entice sufficient enough people to attend to make it a success.

The good stuff was a result of hard work. When I pulled up to the parking lot at Alameda I was met with a host of vendor vehicles and a nice shady spot to show our cars. I know this didn't just happen by chance. This group had provided three important elements for a successful event- a nice location, interested spectators (many from the senior home) and stuff for folks to eat a and drink.

You'll notice I didn't mention the cars, because attracting cars could be a significant problem. This is the lesson to be learned. Anyone working on your first effort should follow what happened to the Alameda Show planners. Remember it was only a short time to the show. The planners did a very smart thing... **they contacted the NM Council of Car Clubs**. What I mean by contacting the Council is they attended our October meeting and explained their plight. We were told they only had 3 registrations. On the Council's side we stepped up and provided immediate publicity through our events calendar and publicity by contacting those on our extensive mailing list. Remember, it was only two weeks before the show—so how did that all work out?

As the saying goes, "The proof is in the pudding". When the show began there were more than 10 cars on display, of all sorts and kinds. The spectators were delighted to experience the cars and feast on the food from the accompanying food trucks. By all standards, the show was a unqualified success and for a first year's effort they get a cheery on top!

I'll end this report by thanking the organizers of this event for the professional way we were treated by the staff of the facility. I usually don't say this, but they made have offered us too much kindness. After eating all that food I went and had a nap as soon as I got home.
